President's Report

It is with great pleasure and honour that I present my report as president. Firstly, I would like to take this opportunity to emphasize that as Club President, the Committee and I have the responsibility for overseeing the learn to swim program of Yarra Swim School and the competitive squads, as each of these operate under 'The Club' umbrella. With that in mind, I begin by offering a sincere thank you to our Committee, Coaches and Swim School staff for what they have helped us achieve over this difficult last year.

I want to extend a sincere thank you to all of our families for your membership and support over what began again as a very unusual year! I am proud of how both our athletes and coaches have persevered through the challenges.

The 2021/22 season was another unconventional 12 months. Continuity and momentum was difficult to sustain with the disruption and inconvenience provided by COVID. Despite these disruptions we still managed to come together as a club, maintain strong membership numbers, and began to rebuild our business.

I am grateful that the business weathered the storm following further COVID closures, but with lots of hard work our finances have been managed meticulously to keep the business operational and in a strong position for the next period of full operation. Our Treasurer (Craig), centre manager (Ash) and swim school administrator (Ryan) have done a tremendous job.

The club also welcomed some new faces to the committee, Craig Stevens, Susan Daly, Mandy Athanasiou and Linda Wein. We also welcomed a new coach, Milly Burnett to support our head coach, Andy, with her fantastic programs.

Despite the rocky start to the season our swimmers achieved some fantastic accomplishments which will be highlighted later in this annual report.

The 2021/22 year has been the most hectic in my presidential career. We started off in lockdown however, come October we were released, and training commenced in earnest. All our swimmers desperately trained hard with the end goal of the Vic Long Course Age Championships. We had a great representation of eleven swimmers competing. We had some great results and Rohan Wein exceeded expectations by qualifying for four individual National Events.

After a successful National competition for Rohan, we were presented with some unexpected news. Coach Andy was leaving the club and undertaking a sea change by moving to Geelong. She also took a great opportunity as a coach for the Geelong Swim Club.

This set the wheel in motion that would fundamentally change the nature of Yarra Plenty. Coach Alex from EC Waves reached out and discussions commenced about integrating EC Waves into Yarra Plenty. This integration was confirmed with an execution date of 1 July 2022. The competitive arm was re-launched with a new name of "Yarra Plenty Waves". The overall corporate structure and incorporated name has not changed. The Parent Entity is still called Yarra Plenty Swimming Club Inc.





ASH CRIMMINS

Yarra Swim School finally returned to regular operations after COVID restrictions eased for the second half of Term 4, 2021 with measures in place to ensure the facility remained COVID safe. Term 1 of 2022 was the first term uninterrupted by lockdowns for two years!

With no significant drop in participation levels and the continual refinement of programs, Yarra Swim School is well placed to quickly recover from the uncertainty of the past two years and strengthen its position as a lead aquatic and community facility in the Greenborough area.

LEARN TO SWIM

> With strong participation levels following the resumption of regular operations the Swim School focus has been on consolidation and recovery from the disruptions of the previous two years. Whilst the business continues to feel the effects of COVID refinements to programs, policies and documentation of procedures see the Swim School in a strong position.

SCHOOL PROGRAMS

- All schools returned in 2021/22 along with the acquisition of a couple of schools new to the facility. Headed by Schools Coordinator, Tarnya Iddon the programs have built an excellent reputation offering accessibility and flexibility many other operators in that space cannot. Despite the impact of staff shortages Yarra Swim School was able to accommodate all school bookings with program modifications necessary at times.
- A continued focus is required to engage with schools during the quite term 2 and 3 period where we have the capacity to accommodate far more programs.




ENROLMENTS

- > Terms 3 and 4 saw Melbourne's last COVID lockdown and the Swim School unable to operate until October 2021
- > Upon returning there was high demand with enrolment levels exceeding targets
- Occupancy levels in classes have remained close to the target of 80% which allows room for student progression whilst maintaining solid profit margins
- Whilst COVID isolations, influenza and staff illness resulted in absences and some class cancellation, this did not impact enrolment levels

LEARN TO SWIM ENROLMENTS




CLASS OCCUPANCY






CASUAL VISITS

- Since returning casual swims have been significantly down on previous years
- Illness and COVID concerns are likely to have been a major contributor as a large portion of our regular swimmers are seniors and particularly vulnerable
- A number of casual swim sessions now share pool space with our programs reducing the cost impact, other sessions will continue to be monitored as attendances dwindle and associated costs rise



AQUA AEROBICS

- > Whilst attendances have been lower than previous years since returning in October, numbers began to increase toward the end of the year
- As with casual attendances illness and COVID concerns are likely to have been a major contributor as the vast majority of Aqua patrons are seniors
- Aqua participants continue to be some of our most loyal and vocal supporters with some having attended for over 20 years









HUMAN RESOURCES

- > An industry wide shortage of appropriately qualified and experienced staff impacted Yarra Swim School which combined with staff illness and mandatory isolation periods resulted in the cancellation of a number of classes. The impact has been minimised at our swim school with a number of new swim teachers progressing through the club ranks bringing with them club values and experience, strengthening the ties between club and swim school.
- Swim School Administration Officer, Ryan Leaper has taken a lead role in financial processes significantly improving efficiencies and fee collection, Ryan also stepped up to take on a number of management responsibilities and has proved an invaluable asset.
- > Senior Swim Teacher, Louise Novak has become and AUSTSWIM presenter and assessor adding to her already vast skillset and strengthening her ability to support and mentor the teacher team and lead in-house professional development.


HEALTH AND SAFETY

As necessary within the Aquatic Industry, health and safety remains a key focus at Yarra Swim School and is reflected in not having recorded any significant incidents or injuries. Procedures continue to be refined and resulted in a significant improved score in the Lifesaving Victoria Facility Assessment undertaken in April

FACILITY

- With a focus on recovery, no significant facility improvements were undertaken in 2021/22. Banyule City Council completed external paintworks and gutter repairs along with the removal of the side fence to allow of a future garden bed and improve the presentation of the facility.
- Despite the aging plant, it has performed well with minor repairs and maintenance mostly undertaken by staff over the past year and generally maintaining excellent water quality and being fully compliant with Health Department testing.

Financial Report

CRAIG STEVENS

Treasurer 2021-Present



I present my report on the un-audited financial statements of Yarra Plenty Swimming Club Inc. for the year ended 30 June 2022.

In summary, it was a very difficult year, navigating COVID lockdowns and restrictions, without the benefit of JobKeeper for staff. It was a matter of consolidation and bunkering down.

In hindsight, last year's reported surplus failed to recognise the significant outstanding amounts owing to the Tax Office, Banyule Council, Utilities and Workcover. Therefore, this led the swim club moving from a reported surplus of \$53,876 surplus to a forecast loss of \$142,652.

We have made significant improvements to the financial reporting during the year, moving from Myob to Xero, and in doing so correcting prior transactions and removing amounts that were showing as owing and due, whereas they were paid already or duplicated. This will lead to a change to the reported surplus in 2021, however we will wait for the finalised audit being conducted by GNS Group (another change).

From a fiscal viewpoint, the income and expense comparison to last year is meaningless, wages in 2021 the business paid wages and received JobKeeper in return, during 2022 we had to stand down staff. The business only traded for swim school for 2 terms. However, for interest a concise summary of the key revenue & expense accounts is attached.

Debt repayments – we entered into payment terms with all creditors, with most paid off already or in advance of schedule and by November, the ATO and Banyule will be fully paid off.

So as we move into 2023 calendar year, the business will be operating with no carried over debts and a clean balance sheet.

Profit and Loss
