Stay well and I look forward to seeing you all soon in person (with a face mask).



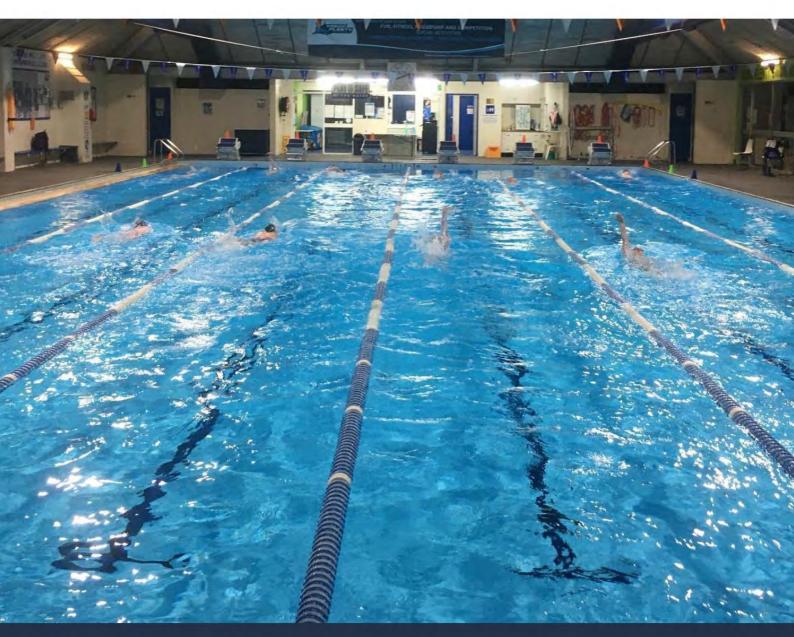

Metro North Junior District Selection trials - Coach Ally and Club Captain Milly assisted 12 swimmers achieve an abundance of PB's with a total of 32 top 10 placings resulting in 10 swimmers qualifying to compete at the Metro All Juniors Championships.

November 2019

- Shepparton Aquacarnivale 13 swimmers attended with swimmers trying new events and more state qualifying times achieved.
- Northcote Encouragement 10 swimmers attended with plenty of PB's on the day.
- Ballarat LC meet 9 swimmers attended with all swimmers achieving at least one PB.
 Rohan Wein achieved 3 Age State qualifying times and Ryan Leaper achieved an Open State qualifying time.









December 2019

- Diamond Creek Encouragement big turn out for our junior swimmers with Coach Ally and Club Captains Nathan and Milly ensuring everyone at all experience levels had a blast.
- LC Vic Age State Championships 12 swimmers representing YAP with individual and relay swims. Sensational swimming with lots of PB's with some huge time drops in the relay swims.

January 2020

February 2020

 6 swimmers achieved a top 10 ranking across all 4 strokes.
 - Vic LC State Sprint Champs 9 swimmers attended with 60% PB's swum.
 Abbie Cooper was a finalist in the 50 brst.
 - Primary and Secondary school swimming many YAP swimmers making in through to higher levels in multiple events.

March 2020

 Metro LC Champs - 5 swimmers attended with Rohan Wein swimming his first ever finals session for 100 brst & 100 fly and Abbie Cooper made finals for the 200 IM.

April & May 2020

#YAPoutofwater challenge - 9 week challenge that assisted and encouraged all YAP athletes to maintain fitness, stay connected with the Club and engage in additional activities including; mindfulness, creativity, nutrition/cooking, goal setting and stretching. Dryland program delivered over Zoom.

June 2020

- Covid normal pool training all squads were able to return to a modified training timetable.
 Swimmers, parents and all staff did an exceptional job of following new rules and regulations around social distancing and hygiene.
- Appointment of assistant coach Paige Trudgeon to the coaching team.
- Swim-a-thon raised money for the Cystic Fibrosis Community Care. Swimmers had a blast challenging themselves and testing their fitness gained from a month of training.

July & August 2020

FINANCIAL REPORT

I present my report on the draft financial statements of Yarra Plenty Swimming Club Inc. for the year ended 30 June 2020. The draft financial statements are presented at this AGM. Once the audited statements are released, I shall send out to all members.

The principal activity of the Club during the financial year was to promote, administer and encourage the sport of swimming for all ages and ability to the community.

2019-20 Financial Position

The overall YTD position to the end of June 2020 is a loss of \$92,069. It is difficult to compare to last year due to COVID but with help the of Job Keeper we are maintaining a viable business. A lot of hard work and activity has been undertaken by the Swim School and Committee to implement changes required in these difficult times. We are aiming to reopen with new programs to improve our financial position going forward.

Key Financial Movements for 2019-20

Revenue

Overall, Revenue for the 2019-20 financial year has decreased by 29.7% from the previous year

It has been difficult in the last half of year due to needing to suspend the Swimming School business because of Covid-19. Some key points regarding this years revenue:

- Decrease in swim school revenue due to learn to Swim program needing to being suspended from March 2020.
- · School lessons remain strong.
- Increase in Fundraising revenue from last year.
- We received several grants from State and Federal Government which has resulted in new pool painting and new lane ropes.

We have received financial assistance from Local, State and Federal Government to help our business to survive such as Job Keeper, rent & utilities put on hold and business tax incentive.

Expenses

Total expenses for the 2019-20 financial year has decreased by approx. 7.2% from the previous year. This has been due to decreased use of the pool.

The key factor was during pool painting maintenance the pool was drained and was not refilled until 6 weeks later that resulted large reduction of heating and chemical use.

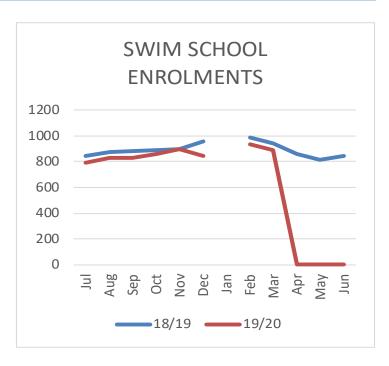

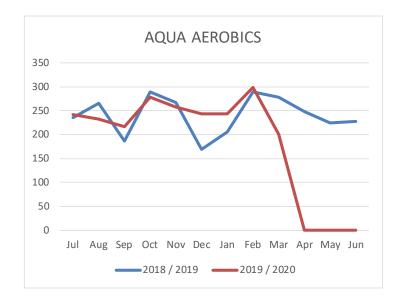

2019 / 2020 Highlights

- Human Resources: Yarra Swim School employed between 40 to 50 staff throughout the year; many of whom are former Swim School students and/or Swimming Club members.
- Schools Program: Prior to the March closure there were over 16,000 student attendances for the Schools Swimming program from 12 schools.
- Health and Safety: No major incidents, injuries or emergencies were reported.
- Bushfire Fundraiser: A pool party and movie night conducted in February attracted approximately 70 people and just over \$1000 was raised (well supported by volunteer staff and Club members).
- Staff Training: Lifesaving Victoria staff in-service training program successfully introduced.
- Administration: New reporting and data collection process introduced.
- Capital Works: A number of improvements were made to the facility including: new pool pump installation (spare also provided), pool painting, ceiling repairs and LED pool hall lighting installation.











2019 / 2020 Challenges

- Human Resources: A casual staffing pool comprising largely of students leads to coverage issues around exam and holiday time. A new manager commenced in late September following a period when the position was vacant. The onset of COVID-19 has delayed planned recruitment of addition permanent staff.
- School Scheduling: Whilst we have a year round facility, school demand for our programs
 continues to be strongest in terms 1 and 4, whilst we have been able to accommodate
 bookings this creates a scheduling challenges and a strain on staff resources, whilst the
 pool is significantly underutilised during the cooler months.
- Aging Infrastructure: Whilst no significant issues have arisen since the replacement of the pool pump in September a number of plant and facility assets have been identified for renewal or refurbishment to improve the operation and presentation.
- Competitors: Yarra Swim School operates within a very competive environment with major facilities, franchises and private operators providing a similar suite of programs.

COVID-19

- COVID-19 (Coronavirus) restrictions forced the stoppage of all programs on 22 March.
- Changes to restrictions allowed squad training to return briefly in June/July, we were also able to host DVE and EC Waves Swimming Clubs during this time in accordance with strictly enforced protocols.
- Procedures and protocols have been established to allow the resumption of regular opertations as when restrictions allow.
- Banyule City Council have provided support by suspending rent payments and utility providers have also placed accounts on hold.
- JobKeeper was secured and is being dispersed for over 30 staff who meet the criteria.













2020 / 2021 Focus

- Return to operations within COVID-19 restrictions; managing risk and maintaining a safe environment, focus on participant retention.
- Re-securing a long term lease with Banyule City Council.
- Change room renewal: planning for change rooms upgrades are underway with works anticipated prior to 2021.
- Recruitment: new permanent administrative role to be undertaken following resumption of business.
- Continuous improvement: ongoing review of program structure/product development, business model, staff development, marketing and promotion and development of new income streams.
- Facility: development and implementation of renewal and refurbishment program in conjunction with Banyule City Council.
